Camp Kulin has an exciting new addition to its internationally recognised teambuilding program thanks to support from CBH, Kulin AOOBs and Curtin Volunteers.

A sensory walk, low ropes elements and a soon to be added giant human foosball game will be utilised by local children and children from right across WA.

“These resources are to our knowledge the first of their kind in the Wheatbelt, and will enable schools and groups to utilise them in Kulin on excursions and camps rather than travelling to Perth or further afield,” Camp Kulin Manager Tanya Dupagne said.

“We will also be using them on our school holiday camp programs and other events.”

All of the elements teach teamwork, communication, problem solving, listening, perseverance, respect, self confidence and self esteem.

The project was funded by CBH Grass Roots Fund, Kulin AOOBs and the Shire of Kulin, and Curtin Volunteers and Camp Kulin Camp Counsellors assisted in the construction.

Over 100 students from Corrigin, Narrogin and Perth have already utilised the new equipment in the first week of it being installed.
